## From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

Many years ago a ship named *MV Doña Cassandra* sunk en route from Butuan to Cebu, Philippines. The vessel sank at the shark infested waters of Bohol Sea bringing sev-

eral hundred passengers with her. More than a hundred perished in the tragedy, which was blamed primarily on bad weather.

There were four Good Shepherd Sisters on that ship: Sisters Concepcion Conti, Consuelo Chuidian, Mary Catherine Loreto, and Virginia Gonzaga. At one point during the sinking, they were given their own individual life vests. They immediately took them and put them on. However, when they started going around the ship, they realized that many of the passengers did not have any life vests simply because there were not enough for all.

Thus, without hesitation, they courageously took off their own life vests and gave them to people who had none. In the end, when rescuers started recovering and counting the bodies of the victims who had drowned, they included the bodies of these four sisters.

In today's gospel reading, a scholar of the law asked Jesus, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" In response Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. . . You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

For some of us, especially those who are "skeptics," hearing these two commandments, we may ask, "What? Loving God with ALL your heart, ALL your soul, ALL your mind? And your neighbor as yourself? Is this really possible? Can this really be done? Can people, real people, truly love like this?"

An answer to such skepticism is what those four Good Shepherd sisters did. They achieved what some people may think is simply not possible. Exactly by giving, offering their own life vests to those who had none, all in the name of faith in their God and all in the continue next page

name of genuine concern for their neighbor, they were able to manifest and express a love, which is the very kind of love, the very quality of love which Jesus speaks of and insists on in today's gospel reading - unconditional, uncompromising love! How can we learn to love like this?

Loving is an art. Like any art, it is learned not through books, not through seminars, not through discussions, but through actual practice. For just as a person learns how to play the piano only by actually playing the piano, just as a person learns how to drive a car only by actually driving a car, we learn how to love much only by actually loving much.

That is why we need to realize that our quality of loving needs to be given time - time to grow, time to deepen. This is so because we do not immediately begin to love God with all our heart, with all our mind, and all our strength. And surely, we do not all of a sudden just begin to love our neighbor as we love our selves. Indeed it is quite apparent that we are not natural-born lovers!

Our way of loving may initially be self-centered. Our way of loving may be self-seeking, self-serving. Many times, perhaps, we are too concerned with "what will I get in return?" What will I receive in return?"

However, after much practice our quality of loving may slowly, gradually begin to become less and less self-serving, less and less self-seeking, and become more and more Christ-like. Like any act that we have to learn, it might be difficult in the beginning, just as a baby finds it difficult to walk at first. But when one does it often enough, it becomes easy. It becomes easier to love.

This was most likely the case with the four Good Shepherd sisters. A person does not decide to give up his or her life in the name of love in an instant. Great and heroic acts of love are surely preceded by small acts of love - small, little acts of charity, simple acts of kindness and gentleness.

In other words, what those four sisters did at the sinking of the MV Doña Cassandra was not an isolated event. They had been loving much even before this disaster. They had been caring much long before this tragedy took place. What happened in that ship was just a culmination, a climax to all the acts of loving in their lives.

Practice. This is how the art of loving works. This is how, in the end, we can learn, aided by God's grace to love with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind, and to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. That is why we should not belittle our simple acts of loving. We should not belittle our very capacity to love - giving thanks, forgiving people, giving our time and sharing our talents and treasure, affirming others. This is how we begin.

Let us pray for God's grace that we may learn the art of loving.

#### **EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024**

Series of Short Catechesis on the Eucharist

Why is the Eucharist important? The sacraments are the crown of the Catholic faith, and the Eucharist is the crown of the sacraments. Why are the sacraments the crown of the Catholic faith? Because the God we believe in the Creeds and obey in the Commandments, we meet and receive in the sacraments. Why is the Eucharist the crown of the sacraments? Because "in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself"(CCC 1324). Baptism is the most necessary sacrament, because without Baptism we cannot receive the other sacraments and we cannot get to heaven. Yet, despite all the wonderful things that Baptism and the other five sacraments accomplish in the soul, they still are but instruments of God for the giving of grace. Whereas in the Eucharist we have not merely an instrument for the giving of grace but we have the actual Giver of grace himself, Jesus Christ our Lord, truly and personally present.

Why is the Eucharist the source and summit of the Christian

life? The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life because the Eucharist is both the origin and the end of that supernatural reality which is the point of everything in the Catholic religion. That reality, called by many different names, such as "salvation", "eternal life", "sanctifying grace", "Kingdom of God", and "Christian life", consists in participating in the very life of God. The Eucharist is the origin of that because it does more than merely symbolize it: the Eucharist actually gives us that. And the Eucharist is the culmination of the Christian life, of man's life in relation to God, because it "is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Hoy Spirit" (CCC1325). In other words, the Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life because the Eucharist is not only a way to receive grace, but it is Jesus himself, who is the source of all graces, and the goal or summit of our lives. وحأتم

#### Saint's Corner:

#### St. Anthony Mary Claret October 24

Anthony Mary Claret was born at Sellent, Spain, in 1807. From his childhood he practiced his father's trade of cloth -weaving. His extraordinary intelligence drew him to seek the priesthood. At age 22 he entered the seminary and was ordained a priest in 1835. But he wanted to become a foreign missionary, so he entered the Jesuit novitiate in Rome but illness cause him to see that the life of a Jesuit was not where he was being called.

He returned to Spain and undertook pastoral activities among his own people. Throughout Catalonia he gave parish missions and retreats centered on the Holy Eucharist and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for which he became popular. Eventually in 1849 Anthony founded the congregation of the *Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary* (known today as the *Claretians*).

The following year Fr. Claret was appointed archbishop of Santiago in Cuba, a much-neglected archdiocese. Courageously he set about to reform it. He preached against concubinage and championed the cause of the black slaves. He encouraged credit unions among the people and proposed sound farming methods, like rotation of crops and family-owned farms instead of the existing single crop, sugar cane, owned by landlords. These efforts provoked the hostility of vested interests. Several attempts were made on his life - 14 to be exact. In one instance a hired assassin slashed open his face and wrist.

In 1857 Archbishop Claret was recalled to Spain and appointed chaplain of Queen Isabella II. He was a prolific writer. Aside from his duties as chaplain for the queen, he got involved in the apostolate of the press. In several places he founded societies for the publishing and distribution of free Catholic literature, much of which he wrote himself.

During the Spanish Revolution of 1868, he accompanied the queen into exile in France. From there he went to Rome and participated in the First Vatican Council, winning the admiration of his fellow bishops because of his eloquent defense of papal infallibility. Shortly afterwards he returned to France and there a fatal illness overcame him. He died on October 24, 1870 at the age of 63. Pope Pius XII canonized him in 1950.




