



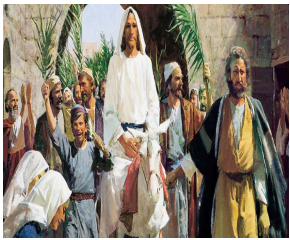

## PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD MARCH 24, 2024



### *From the Pastor's Desk*

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord  
March 24, 2024  
Mark 14:1-15:47  
Dear Ascension Family,

Greetings of peace and good health! Today's liturgy begins the Holy Week. On this day we seem to be doing contradictory things. We call it Palm Sunday, and we also call it Passion Sunday. The liturgy today commemorates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The Jews turned it into a jubilant occasion. They see this moment as the beginning of a glorious era for themselves, with Jesus as their king. They shout "Hosanna!" It is a word that has deep meaning for them. In Hebrew, it means, "Save now!" It is the old Jewish cry from the heart of salvation. Of course, the salvation that is uppermost in their hearts at this moment is political salvation. Their holy city and their holy nation are polluted with a Gentile presence and a pagan god, with the empire of Rome and its Caesar-God. They are thinking of a political restoration - the restoration of the kingdom of David!

What the people do not realize is that as Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem, he is entering into his death. That is why in today's liturgy we seem to be doing contradictory things. We have a number of conflicting elements, a paradox if not a contradiction: a King and a convicted criminal, shouts of "hosannas" and shouts of "Crucify Him!", triumph and tragedy. And all these in one liturgy. Does it make sense? Indeed it does, because we are celebrating the Paschal Mystery.

What is the paschal Mystery? An inseparable twosome, a duality: the dying-rising of Jesus. Most of us have been taught in the past to have a sharp dividing line between Lent and Easter. Lent meant that we live again in memory of the dying

of Jesus, so that on Easter we might relive his rising. This practice appears like a yearly liturgical acting, a play! Lent is no more a preparation for the rising of Jesus that Advent was a preparation for his birth. Jesus will not rise next Sunday, no more than he was born in the crib last Christmas. This is to stress the history at the expense of the mystery. There is indeed a history: Jesus did move from a desert to a garden to a cross to a tomb from which he rose. And in Lent we try to re-live that movement, but not as if Jesus is not yet risen. The fact is, Jesus has already died and risen; we dare not pretend he has not. Lent is not the dying of Jesus and Easter is not his rising. The whole of Lent is a progressively more intense initiation into the twin reality of Jesus dead and risen.

Today, Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, this whole week, we enter with growing intensity into the whole paschal mystery. Not palms only nor passion only; it is both. Not triumph only nor tragedy only, but triumph in tragedy. Not a dying or a rising Christ; but a dying-rising Christ. The paschal mystery is one mystery: life in and through death.

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, is not therefore a prelude to the Resurrection. The tragedy of Calvary is not a promise of triumph at Easter. The cross is itself a triumph. In Christ's death there is life. The King is triumphant not simply on Easter; He is triumphant on Calvary. Dying-rising is one complex reality, the mystery of Christ.

What does this have to do with our everyday Christian living? Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion reveals the core of Christian living. For us Christians, to live is to share in the dying-rising of Christ. Not in the two stages: dying here, rising hereafter. No but as with Jesus, it should be with us. Our dying-rising is a double inseparable reality. In our dying is our rising now. It began with our baptism. On this St. Paul is emphatic: "Do you know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life"(Romans 6:3-4).

Newness of life now, not after death but now. At this moment the life of Christ flows through us like another bloodstream. That is why we can cry out with St. Paul: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:19b-20). In Christ we are a new creation. But our dying-rising is not simply a matter of sacraments.

And so we must constantly reproduce the journey of Jesus to Jerusalem, not only in the liturgy, but in our flesh and bones. In this life we rise to new life only by dying to self. Dying to self is never-ending. For dying to self is turning to Christ, and turning to Christ is a constant conversion.

## Saint's Corner:

St. Cyril of Jerusalem  
March 18

Cyril was born of Christian parents around the year 315 and brought up in Jerusalem, where he received an excellent education, especially in Holy Scripture. About the year 345 he was ordained a priest and given the task of catechizing those preparing for baptism. This role gave him the opportunity to create his primary surviving writing, the one which earned him the designation of Doctor of the Church. This is a collection of 23 catechetical lectures. The first 18 were given during Lent, and the concluding five instructed the newly baptized during the weeks after Easter. These lectures or *Catecheses* remain valuable as examples of the teaching and ritual of the Church in the middle of the 4th century.

Cyril became bishop of Jerusalem around the year 350, and thereafter his life was a constant battle against the Arian heresy. Arianism, the great heresy which divided the Church in the 4th century, taught that Jesus, the Son of God, was a creature of *like* substance, but *not* of the *same* substance as God the Father. Bishops were divided between orthodox bishops and Arian bishops. Bishops were sent into exile. Three times Cyril was sent into exile. The first time was because a group of powerful Arian bishops deposed him. On two other occasions the Arian Emperors Constantius and Valens exiled him in turn. All in all Cyril spent 16 years in exile, almost half of his 35 years as bishop. Despite the complex politics of the Arian heresy, his faith was the orthodoxy of the Catholic faith. At the Council of Constantinople, which was held in 381 and gave a death-blow to Arianism, Cyril was praised as a champion of orthodoxy against the Arians. This was entirely confirmed in 1882 when Pope Leo XIII declared him Doctor of the Church. Cyril died in the year 387.

Cyril is a model in many respects. He loved the truth dearly, and out of faithfulness to the truth, suffered much. However, he was always willing to reach out to his adversaries in an effort to understand their point of view. It takes a lot of courage to be faithful "to the truth, and nothing but the truth," as we repeat in our courts of law. One must be at the same time uncompromising as regards truth itself - to the point of suffering for it, if need be - and at the same time aware that we do not have a monopoly on truth and that our adversaries usually possess, part of it. A Christian love of truth will make us lovers of Christ (who is the Truth) and lovers of our opponents, who also are seekers of the truth, perhaps even more than we are.

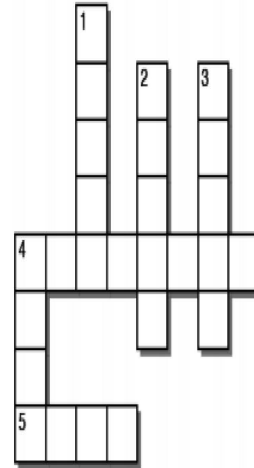

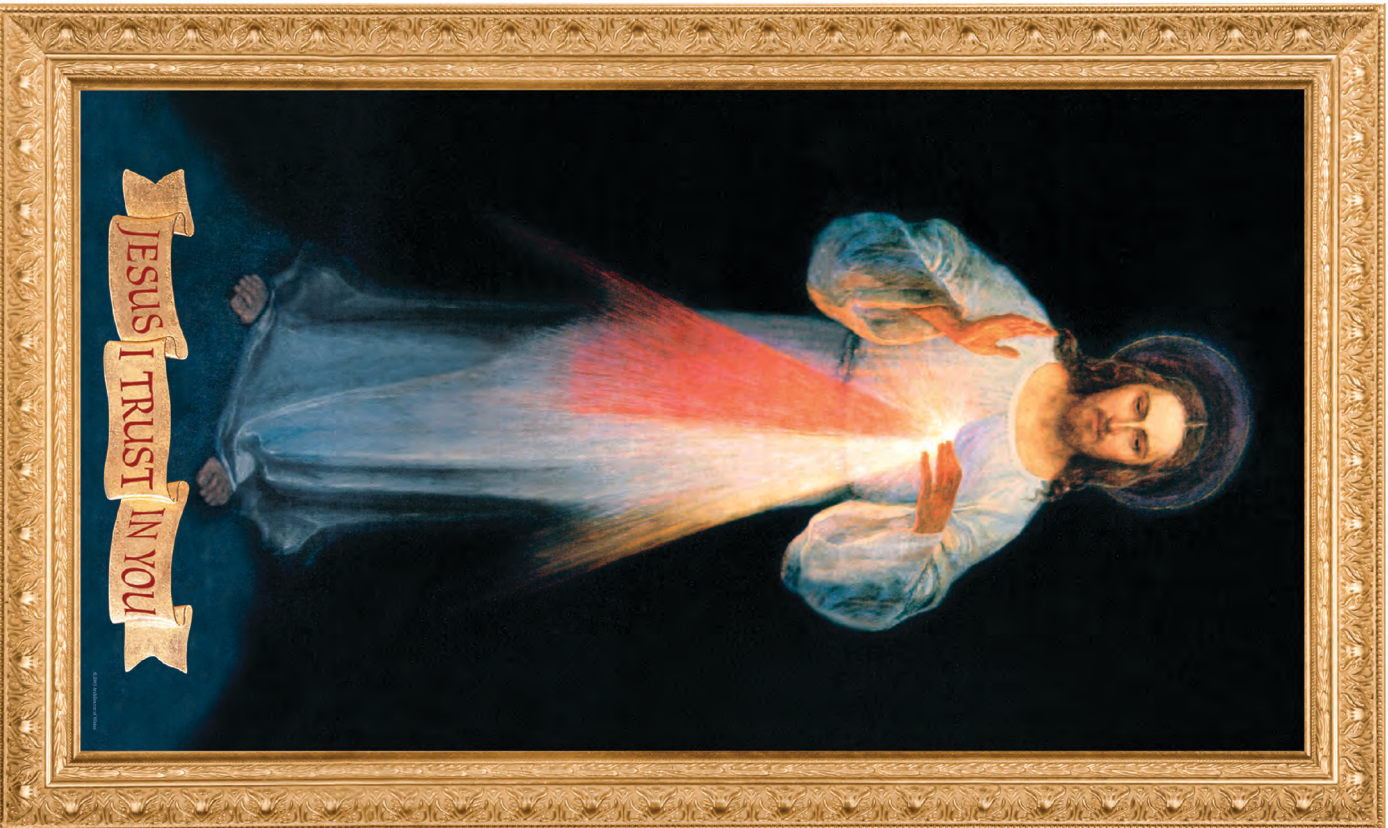
