



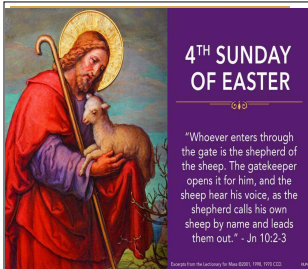

From the Pastor's Desk

Fourth Sunday of Easter
April 21, 2024
Luke 24:35-48

Dear Ascension Family,

Greetings of peace and good health!

This Sunday, we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday. This day is also designated as a World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

In today's gospel reading Jesus calls himself the good shepherd. And he sets a big difference between being a good shepherd and a mere hired hand. The good shepherd cares for his sheep whatever the cost. He is concerned with the safety of the sheep before all else. This is so true that, if need be, he will endanger his life in defending them against wolves and thieves. His loyalty to the sheep is firm and unshakeable, because his heart is very much in his work. Love does not measure what it gives.

The hireling, on the other hand, is one who does a job, not because he wants to, but because he has to. And he does it solely for the money. His heart is not in it, and so he lacks the commitment of the Good Shepherd. Because he is motivated by his pay and not by love, the hireling will do his job but no more. If he is called to do more - for example, to face attacking wolves, he will simply run away. This is not unexpected. After all, his main interest is his pay, not the safety of the sheep.

By the very nature of their profession, shepherds have to be faithful people, constantly with their flocks. The sheep could depend on the shepherd in any crisis. Hired substitutes just do not function in the same way. They don't give their lives because it was not for love but for pay that they work.

This characteristic of the good shepherd's love for his sheep is found in Jesus in the highest degree. He not only risked his life for us, he laid down his life for us.

Jesus is not only our Good Shepherd. He also invites us to be good shepherds to others under our care, whether it be as parents, teachers, catechists, lay leaders, religious leaders, politicians, government leaders, policemen, business leaders. We must examine our attitudes, motivations and behavior in our relationship to work and people. Are we there only to work for pay, or are we doing what we are doing because it is our profession which we are trained for or good at, or do we look at our work as a vocation, a call and an opportunity to love and care for the people entrusted to us?

I am reminded of a Filipino priest by the name of Father Rhoel Gallardo. He was a Claretian missionary priest assigned to a village in the troubled island of Basilan located in the southern part of the Philippines.

There was a Catholic mission school in the village, headed by Father Gallardo. The terrorist group, Abu Sayyaf, demanded money from the teachers in the amount of one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) monthly per teacher, and from the school itself in the amount of ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) monthly. Father Gallardo refused. Clearly things were becoming dangerous for Father Gallardo.

Because of the danger, the Bishop decided to pull him out of the place, and was given a new assignment. He was supposed to be in his new assignment on April 28, 2000. But Father Gallardo asked to be allowed to stay until after the graduation on March 30 and the feast of the village afterwards. He never made it to his new assignment. He was abducted on April 20 by the Abu Sayyaf along with about 75 pupils and teachers, the majority of whom were later released. But more that 20 were kept as hostages, Father Gallardo among them. He was tortured while in captivity. When, concerned like the good shepherd, he asked about the whereabouts of the female teachers, he would be punished. (The Abu Sayyaf was known to rape their female hostages.) Whenever he would lead the male hostages in praying the rosary every evening at 6:00, he would be tortured. His captors even pulled out the nails in his index fingers and toes. Finally, as his hands were tied as he lay face down on the ground, he was shot at the back of the head and killed together with three other companions on May 4. About one third of his head was blown off.

Among the early demands of the Abu Sayyaf was the removal of all crosses in churches in Basilan. Faced with these harsh realities, one Basilan diocesan priest said, "We will continue to be here and we will continue to spread the word of God." Basilan Bishop Romulo de la Cruz said, "It is a cross we have to carry." A cross that good shepherd must bear.

We may not know much of the details of how Father Gallardo conducted himself during his captivity. Of one thing we are sure though: he gave his life for his flock. He was their good shepherd to the end.

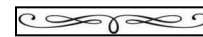

Saint's Corner:

St. Pius V
April 30

Born in Bosco, Italy, in 1503, Antonio Ghislieri grew up in a poor family and, as a boy, tended flocks. At the age of 14 he entered the Dominican Order and proved to be a model monk. In 1528 he was ordained a priest and for the next 16 years he either taught philosophy and theology or filled various important positions in his Order. In 1556 he was ordained a bishop and the following year he was made a cardinal by Pope Paul IV. In 1566, Cardinal Ghislieri was elected pope and took the name Pius V. He was a reforming Pope at a time that the Church was in need of reform. It was the time of the Protestant revolt. To address the need of reform, the Council of Trent had been called but its sessions went on for some 18 years due to apathy and reluctance to engage in serious reform.

Pius V was neither apathetic nor reluctant to reform. He began to enforce the spirit and letter of the decrees of the Council of Trent, starting in Rome. Funds that were to be spent for his coronation as Pope were given to hospitals and to the poor. In a space of six short years Pius V published the *Roman Catechism*, the predecessor of the *Catechism* we have today. He promulgated a new Roman Missal to standardize the way Mass was celebrated in a time of division. He ordered the founding seminaries for the proper training of priests, insisted on the need for bishops to reside in their diocese and for pastors to reside in their parish, enforced legislation against abuses, and so on.

During those crucial years in the life of the Church, two menacing shadows were darkening the future: the spread of Protestantism and the inroads of the Turks. Pius V organized a coalition against the Turks that resulted in victory at the Battle of Lepanto that saved Europe for Christianity. To attain victory, he asked the Christian world to pray the Rosary and has been called the Pope of the Rosary. He was a great reformer who was Pope for only six years but in those few years he achieved a great deal to keep the Church true to her mission. With the Protestants, he was not fortunate. His excommunication of Queen Elizabeth I backfired against English Catholics, who thereafter were persecuted accordingly.

Despite his many activities, Pius spent long hours in prayer, fasted rigorously, deprived himself of many papal luxuries. He was also extremely generous and kind towards the poor and the sick. In fact, he often visited hospitals and personally tended the sick with his own hands. He died in 1572 at the age of 68. He was canonized in 1712 by Pope Clement XI.

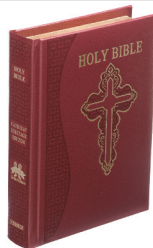
